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Advancing Patient Care:

A New Chapter in Rehabilitation Services at Olmsted Medical Center

t Olmsted Medical Center, providing exceptional, patient-centered care has always been our priority. In our continued commitment to serving southeast Minnesota and delivering comprehensive healthcare solutions, OMC is excited to share the continued growth of our Rehabilitation Services department, and the expansion of our outpatient clinic on Elton Hills Drive.

Rehabilitation Services Overview

The Rehabilitation Services department at OMC provides personalized therapies that are designed to help individuals address pain and loss of ability after an injury, medical condition, or surgery. Our therapists provide care for pediatric and adult populations, with treatment plans tailored to each patient's unique challenges and strengths.

OMC offers a wide range of clinical services within this department, including:

Speech language pathology: Focuses on assessing, diagnosing, and treating communication, voice, and swallowing disorders.

Physical therapy: Focuses on decreasing pain and improving movement and mobility for better function and quality of life.

Occupational therapy: Focuses on improving daily function and quality of life by enhancing upper body movement, providing necessary equipment for independence, and teaching cognitive strategies for daily activities.

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Specialty Therapy Services

Vestibular therapy: Focuses on issues related to the vestibular system, which plays a crucial role in maintaining balance and spatial orientation. Symptoms may include dizziness, vertigo, or unsteadiness.

Occupational hand therapy: Focuses on restoring optimal function and promoting recovery in individuals with hand, wrist, and elbow injuries or conditions, which may include fractures, arthritis, tendon injuries, or post-surgical complications. Treatment may include splinting, use of ultrasound, muscle testing and strengthening exercises.

Industrial rehabilitation therapy: Focuses on rehabilitation for strength and endurance to return to work and prevent future injury. Services include treatment for work-related injuries, ergonomic assessments and training, job function analyses, pre-offer and pre-work screens, and functional capacity assessments for returning to work.

Pediatric therapy: Like adults, pediatric patients may require physical therapy, occupational therapy, or speech pathology for a variety of reasons including, but not limited to torticollis (abnormal head position due to concern with neck muscles), plagiocephaly (asymmetry of the skull), gross motor delay (difficulty reaching motor milestones such as crawling, standing, and walking), toe walking/gait deviations, fine motor delay (difficulty grasping utensils for eating or writing, difficulty with handwriting, self-feeding, dressing), and speech delay or difficulty communicating basic needs.

Pelvic health therapy: Focuses on conditions that affect both women and men. Services include treatment for pelvic pain, incontinence (inability to control urine or bowels), prolapse, orthopedic pelvic pain during pregnancy, and other pelvic floor disorders.

Functional activities of daily living (ADL) and instrumental activities of daily living (IADL) therapy: Focuses on activities for self-care needed to live independently, such as dressing, toileting, and bathing. Services include measurement of a patient's ability to complete daily living activities via functional assessments to evaluate health status, current needs, and potential future needs.

Lymphedema treatment: Lymphedema refers to the buildup of lymph fluid under the skin. OMC's lymphedema therapy focuses on decreasing swelling and preventing complications through exercise, compression garments, manual lymphatic massage, wound treatment, and more.

Massage therapy: Focuses on manual manipulation of the body's soft tissues (muscles, tendons, ligaments) to enhance health and wellbeing. OMC offers massage therapy with a certified massage therapist in a variety of techniques including Swedish massage, deep tissue massage, prenatal massage, reflexology, trigger point, and more.

Benefits of Expansion

With the expansion of our Elton Hills clinic space, we're meeting the increasing demand for rehabilitation services with even more accessible and personalized care, featuring state-of-the-art equipment and technology. This expansion facilitates a wider range of offerings, including driving and low vision assessments, pediatric care addressing gross and fine motor skills, long-term care for neurodegenerative diseases, post-cancer care, and more. Additionally, we offer wellness classes and interventions tailored to individual needs, such as balance, flexibility, and strength training. Conveniently located in central Rochester with ample free parking, our space is designed for comfort and accessibility, accommodating those with mobility aids or special needs.

Patients can schedule an appointment with OMC's Rehabilitation Services department by calling 507.292.7222. Referrals are needed for Occupational Therapy and Speech Language Pathology services. Patients are welcome to call and schedule directly for Physical Therapy (as allowed by your insurance company) but may also need a referral. Call directly to schedule for Massage.
